Mobile App Creates Problems for NMUSD Schools

The Newport-Mess Unified School District warned purents and community members about a mobile app that has become an arenae for cycle-bullying, harsement, violence and other issues, officials made in a message this work.

The "problematic" app, called Clyle, is designed and marketed for students to post videos audior partness about themselves, other students and their school commune.
