9 Fun Facts about Thanksgiving...Did you know?

As the marching bands prepared to take to the streets of New York as part of the Thanksgiving Day Parade, we thought you might like a few fun facts about Thanksgiving!

Do you know what was served at the first Thanksgiving? How about how many calories are consumed on average on Thanksgiving Day?

Here are nine fun facts about Thanksgiving to share.

The first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621 over a three-day harvest festival. It included 50 Pilgrims, 90 Wampanoag Indians, and lasted three days. It is believed by historians that only five women were present.

Turkey wasn't on the menu at the first Thanksgiving. Venison, duck, goose, oysters, lobster, eel, and fish were likely served, alongside pumpkins and cranberries (but not pumpkin pie or cranberry sauce!).

Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a national holiday on October 3, 1863. Sarah Josepha Hale, the woman who wrote "Mary Had A Little Lamb," convinced Lincoln to make Thanksgiving a national holiday after writing letters for 17 years.

The history of U.S. presidents pardoning turkeys is patchy. Harry Truman is often credited with being the first president to pardon a turkey, but that's not quite true. He was the first to receive a ceremonial turkey from the National Turkey Federation – and he had it for dinner. John F. Kennedy was the first to let a Thanksgiving turkey go, followed by Richard Nixon who sent his turkey to a petting zoo. George H.W. Bush is the president who formalized the turkey pardoning tradition in 1989.

There are four towns in the United States named "Turkey." They can be found in Arizona, Texas, Louisiana, and North Carolina.

The average number of calories consumed on Thanksgiving is 4,500.

Butterball answers more than 100,000 turkey-cooking questions via their Butterball Turkey Hotline each November and December.

The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton.

The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920.

More than 55.3 million Americans are expected to travel during the Thanksgiving holiday this year.

Hanukkah is the Jewish holiday which celebrates the victory of the Maccabees over the larger Syrian army. It also celebrates a miracle that happened during this time, where just a day's supply of oil allowed the menorah in the rededicated Temple in Jerusalem to remain lit for eight days.

The seven lamps allude to the branches of human knowledge, **represented** by the six lamps inclined inwards towards, and symbolically guided by, the light of God **represented** by the central lamp. The **menorah** also symbolizes the creation in seven days, with the center light **representing** the Sabbath.

The central feature of the observance of **Hanukkah** is the nightly lighting of the Chanukiah or menorah, an eight-branched candelabra with a place for a ninth candle, the shammes, used to light the others.

In observance of this Holiday, some Cottages will light the Menorah for residents to celebrate Hanukah.



The wonderful employees of Irvine Cottages work very hard to take excellent care of your loved ones all year long. They take a great deal of pride in their work too. This holiday time of year is the one time when you are permitted to express your appreciation for all their efforts.

The policy of Irvine Cottages is "NO TIPPING" – employees are not permitted to accept any gratuity for their service. Known acceptance by any employee of a tip is grounds for immediate dismissal. Please be advised that even during the holiday season we do not want you to make direct contributions to any employee.

The EMPLOYEE HOLIDAY FUND is the time of year when this policy is waived. It is an opportunity for you to express your appreciation to those employees who serve you throughout the year. Funds are distributed privately in a very fair manner – remembering that there are many employees (such as late nights, weekends etc.) whom you may never even see but contribute to your loved ones comfort. Only care staff receive this contribution.

We know we are in hard economic times and any gift amount is appreciated! Some residents choose to give \$1.00 per day for a total of \$365.00. This is a guide only. A recommendation of \$50 - \$500 range is suggested as a possible contribution. Please use your conscience and financial status to determine your decision. Remember, this is the only time of your year you can show your true appreciation to our staff for jobs extremely well done! They really love the bonus and feel beyond grateful for your generosity and kindness.
