2020 IMPACT REPORT

Our Mission: To provide hands-on care and support, information, referrals, education and resources for individuals and families in Orange County and surrounding areas who experience memory loss, Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia.







Only a few months into 2020, we were met by a pandemic that greatly impacts the at-risk community we serve. State mandates closed our congregate services due to stay-at-home orders and social distancing requirements. At Alzheimer's Orange County (AlzOC), it is our mission to continually support care partners, frail seniors and those living with memory loss and dementia, and we knew this was a call to action.

Here's what we've done

Since the pandemic started, we've provided:

Masks distributed to senior care homes, senior meal delivery services, hospitals, clinics, providers, food pantries and

Food distribution events; fortified the Saddleback Food Bank's meal delivery program for seniors

Our Impact on Lives



6,320 people called our Helpline seeking resources and support to help care for someone living with dementia during a pandemic.



6,316 people participated in our Spanish, Korean and Vietnamese programs, supporting our culturally diverse community.



6,559 people joined us virtually to learn about dementia, caregiving, and COVID-19 best practices.



2,037 families met with AlzOC social workers in 2020 - a 23% increase from last year, because of your help.



2,109 care partners found help through our support groups that were moved online to provide help while navigating COVID-19.



2,688 people engaged in brain health programs and memory screenings to keep their brain healthy.



36 new virtual support and education events were created, serving **1,200 each month.**

50 hours of new educational presentations are now available on YouTube @AlzOrangeCounty

700 hours of care consultations were conducted for **92 persons with dementia** living alone.

7,300 hours of support provided to AlzOC constituents by Masters of Social Work interns.

AlzOC's Adult Day Health Care (ADHC) programs - Acacia and South County - supported 362 participants and their families during this unprecedented time. Since our participants could not come to our Day Centers, we brought support and services to them.

32,484 calls were made to participants to conduct wellness checks, provide resources, support and customized care.

29,302 frozen meals were delivered to participants and their care partners to ensure they had access to nutritious meals.

7,611 activity kits were provided to participants to ensure time at home was filled with meaningful projects to help pass time in stimulating ways.

8 "Swing-By" events brought joy to participants providing a safe way to socialize with familiar faces.



The donation of Irvine Cottages was one of 2020's highlights, allowing us to provide a greater role in caring for older adults.

We have implemented new health and safety measures such as sanitization stations at the front door of each Cottage and weekly COVID testing for staff. With diligent compliance of CDC protocols and recommended safety standards, all of our Cottages remain COVID-19 free while caring for 68 residents, keeping the Cottages nearly full at 95% capacity.

Although visitation has been restricted for the protection of our residents, we have incorporated virtual opportunities to ensure those we serve participate meaningful interactions and purposeful engagement.
