## Filipino market Island Pacific Seafood opens in Lake Forest

The Filipino grocery store Island Pacific Seafood Market has debuted in Lake Forest, a first for the chain in Orange County.

The store had its soft opening Sept. 9 and a grand opening and ribbon cutting



Shoppers can expect a wide selection of seafood, meat and produce that leans into Filipino and Asian cuisine. Think long beans, bok choy, Thai chilies, spices and sauces.

Yelp reviews were mostly positive a month into the store's opening. "Everything in stock and neatly organized," wrote a Riverside shopper.

The bakery San Honore sits to the right of the store entrance and features "lots of fresh bread, chicken empanadas, egg pie and taho drink," the Yelp reviewer Winny noted. "All were quite tasty."

Empanadas were \$2.25 each and Taho drink was \$5.95. A half-dozen of cheese rolls cost \$9, she wrote.

Others were impressed by the variety of hot food served at the in-house eatery Philhouse. "The skewers are the biggest. Largest meat, best quality too. Plus the sauce is GREAT!" wrote Ken from Aliso Viejo.

"We absolutely love this place ... and it's because of the wonderful people AND some absolutely amazing FOOD," he wrote.

Artwork by Long Beach-based muralist Bodeck Luna and Filipino cultural artist Kristian Kabuay graces the walls.

The Walnut-based supermarket chain has 18 stores in California and Nevada. The supermarket was founded by Nino Jeff Lim in March 2000 with Panorama City as its first location. Other Southern California locations are in Cerritos and Long Beach.

The Lake Forest store, under development for six months at 23811 El Toro Road, has created 85 jobs so far, according to a company representative.

Island Pacific marks the second significant foray by a Filipino market into the county. Back in 2014, [Seafood City debuted in Irvine](#).

## Tax postponement program accepting applications



Qualifying homeowners can apply for California's Property Tax Postponement program, which allows homeowners who are seniors – or who are blind or have a disability – to defer payment of property taxes on their primary residence.

Funding for PTP is limited, according to State Controller Betty T. Yee, and applications will be processed as they are received. The final filing deadline for the tax year is Feb. 10, 2023.

In the 2021-22 tax year, California homeowners were able to postpone nearly \$4.5 million in residential property taxes, Yee's office reports. This year, the household income limit increases to \$49,017. Household income for the upcoming PTP cycle will be based on the 2021 calendar year.

Participants must reapply each year. A lien will be placed on the property, or a security agreement filed with the Department of Housing and Community Development for a manufactured home, until the account is paid in full.
